




Seventeen-Arch Bridge in the Summer Palace 颐和园



Beijing (Chinese "北京", "bei" means north and "jing" means capital), or known as Peking by westerners in the past, has a history of more than 3000 years. As the political, cultural, and educational center of China today, it has been the capital of one of China's ancient kingdoms since 1045 BC. Since the Mongolian Kublai Khan established Beijing as the national capital in year 1267, Beijing has been the capital city of Yuan(1271-1368), Ming(1368-1644) and Qing(1644-1912) Dynasties. For 700 years, not only the emperors built Beijing into a magnificent city of palaces and gates, the Chinese people themselves have also built temples, hutongs, tunnels, and the Great Wall under the emperor's order to defend foreign invasions. Beijing is now the city that holds the most World Cultural Heritage recognized by the UNESCO. Witnessing China's chaos throughout 19th and 20th century, Beijing recorded history with its ruins. As Mao Zedong declared the establishment of People's Republic of China on the Gate of Tian'anmen on Oct. 1st, 1949, Beijing began its reform toward modernity. Air pollution has become one of the serious problems of the city at the price of rapid development. Today, Beijing is an international municipal and the world's third most populous city. Renowned as one of the 4 ancient capitals of China and radiating influences in politics, economy, education, art, innovation and technology in Asia and the world at the same time, Beijing welcomes guests around the globe and is willing to show you its modern yet ancient beauty.



Most of the year it is a good weather, but not in winter. If you go to Beijing in winter, you have to concern on air pollution, because usually it falls in December and January. As for other seasons, it has a clean air with rainfall and cold wind.

The Forbidden city/ The Palace Museum 紫禁城/故宫

The Forbidden City, also known as the Palace Museum, and Gu Gong in Chinese, lies at the city center of Beijing, and once served as the imperial palace for 24 emperors during the Ming and Qing Dynasties (1368 - 1911). It was first built throughout 14 years during the reign of Emperor Chengzu of Ming (1368-1644). Ancient Chinese Astronomers believed that the Purple Star (Polaris) was in the center of heaven and the Heavenly Emperor lived in the Purple Palace. The Palace for the emperor on earth was so called the Purple City. It was forbidden to enter without special permission of the emperor. Hence its name 'The Purple Forbidden City', usually 'The Forbidden City'. In 1987 it was listed as a World Cultural Heritage Site by UNESCO, the Palace Museum is now one of the most popular tourist attractions world-wide. Official website: http://gugong.228.com.cn

② The Great Wall at Badaling 长城 (八达岭)

The Great Wall of China is one of the attractive places among tourists. It is located on the north of Beijing in Yanqing county, 70 km from Beijing. The total length of the Great Wall is 21196.18km. It has a long history of more than 2,000 years and became a World Heritage Site by the UNESCO in 1987. It was mostly built during the Ming Dynasty (1368 - 1644). The Great Wall has 9 different parts: the nearest to Beijing is Badaling. So mind, this place is crowded.

Travel Tips

1. No advance ticket booking service for this train route. You have to buy tickets on the spot. No need ID for ticket purchasing.

2. For coming back, get to the station and get in the "queue" early. When the train arrives, there's an almighty (but highly amusing) stampede through the double doors to get out onto the platform and onto the train (which instantly fills up).

3. You can use Beijing Transportation smart card for travelling S2 train from Beijing Huangtudian Railway station to Badaling great wall. So If you have a transportation card, you don't have to wait in line for buying a ticket. Just put your card on a reader and go. The S Train is unnumbered, free seating.

4. By bus #877/#919, departing from Deshengmen Arrow Tower parking lot, over 10-minute walk in the east direction from Subway Line 2 - Jishuitan Station.

Ticket price: RMB 12 per person, RMB 6 per person (using transport card) for one way ride, around 1 hour for single trip. Tips*: To the west side of the Deshengmen, some illegal bus owners even claim that their buses are No. 919 or 877 by putting a FAKE sign on front windows. These bus owners may convince you to get on their bus. Please ignore them without any hesitation as these illegal buses will certainly charge more, may take you to some shopping places than the official buses.

The Summer Palace 颐和园

It is located in Haidian district of the northwest of Beijing, 15 km from downtown area. It was constructed by the time of Qing Dynasty (1644-1911) and become a luxurious royal garden for royal families to rest and entertain. Like most of the gardens of Beijing, it could not elude the rampages of the Anglo-French Allied Force and was destroyed by fire. According to historical documents, with original name as 'Qingyi Garden' (Garden of Clear Ripples), the Summer Palace (Yiheyuan) was renamed after its first reconstruction in 1888.

It was also recorded that Empress Dowager Cixi embezzled navy funds to reconstruct it as a resort in which to spend the rest of her life. In 1900, Yiheyuan suffered another hit by the Eight-Power Allied Force and was repaired in the next two years. After the success of the 1911 Revolution, exactly in 1924 it was open to the public. It ranked amongst the World Heritage Sites by UNESCO in 1998, as well as one of the first national tourist spots in China.

🔮 The Old Summer Palace 圆明园

The Old Summer Palace is known as the Ruins of the Yuanmingyuan (the Garden of Perfection and Light). It is located northwest of Beijing and to the east of the (present-day) Summer Palace. The Garden was first constructed in the year of 1709 during the reign of the Emperor Kangxi of the Qing Dynasty (1644-1911). Over the next 150 years of the Qing next 150 years of the Qing Dynasty, this Garden was expanded to be a large-scale Chinese emperors' private pleasure garden, covering a total area of 350 hectares (over 864 acres). The Old Summer Palace is often associated with the European style palaces built of stone. In Qing Dynasty of China, it was a royal palace of emperors and missionaries coming from Europe called as "the Garden of the Gardens".

Tiananmen Square 天安门广场

Locating at the centre of Beijing city, it is the world largest city square which was built in Ming Dynasty of China in 16 th "century. Tiananmen, which means "the gate of heavenly peace" in Chinese, had already become a national symbol of China for most of Cshinese people. Apart from the square itself you can see the Tiananmen Tower, Monument to the People's Heroes, Great Hall of the People, Chairman Mao Zedong Memorial Hall and see the national flag raising ceremony. Prince Gong's Mansion 恭王府

It is Beijing's largest and the best preserved Qing Dynasty (1644-1911) prince mansion and it is located at Qianhai Xijie to the north of Shichahai. The mansion was the residence of Heshen (a Manchu politician in Chinese history, famous for his ability of corruption). He was the Prime Minister and the Minister of Defense in the years of Qianlong, the most prosperous stage of Qing Dynasty. In 1850s, the mansion was bestowed on Prince Gong. 'Gong' means to respect and to be deferential, and his real name was Aisin Gioro Yixin (a Manchurian family name and a Chinese first name). It was an honorable character conferred upon the prince by his elder brother, the emperor.

🭳 Shichahai 什刹海 (The Three Rear Lakes)

Shichahai is a famous scenic area in the northwest part of Beijing, that includes three lakes (Qianhai, meaning Front Sea; Houhai, meaning Back Sea and Xihai, meaning West Sea), surrounding places of historic interest and scenic beauty, and remnants of old-style local residences, Hutong and Courtyard. It's also famous for bars. Shicha Lake has a history of about 700 years from the Yuan Dynasty (1279-1368). It assumed its present name in the Ming Dynasty (1368-1644). Strolling along its shoreline, the visitor can appreciate the lake's glimmering blue water, its graceful weeping willows, its twisting railings and the flower-and-tree-covered central island. Pleasure boats are available for rowing and the banks are amply provided with shady places to rest. A swimming area in the lake is open every summer. In Chinese Zhongyuan festival, there are celebrations of the Buddhist Ghost Festival, as well as the Taoism ones.

§ Yonghegong Lama Temple 雍和宫

Yonghegong Lama Temple is located at the northeast corner of Beijing City, considered as the largest and most perfectly preserved lamasery in present day China. It means a Temple of Peace and Harmony in Chinese. The Temple was built initially in 1694 during the Qing Dynasty. Before this building was the residence of Emperor Yongzheng when he was just a prince. However, in 1744 the Qing Dynasty formally changed the status of the dwelling to that of a lamasery, and so the Yonghe Lamasery became the national centre of Lama Administration.

Temple of Heaven 天坛

The Temple of Heaven is located in the Chongwen district of Beijing. Originally, this was the place where emperors of the Ming Dynasty (1368 - 1644) and Qing Dynasty (1644 - 1911) held the Heaven Worship Ceremony. It is the largest and most representative existing masterpiece among China's ancient sacrificial buildings. It was built in 1420 the 18th year of the reign of Emperor Yongle who started to pray for his country here. In 1988, it was opened to the public as a park, showing ancient philosophy, history and religion. Its grand architectural style and profound cultural connotation give an insight into the practices of the ancient Eastern civilization.

• Temple of Earth 地坛

The Temple of Earth is located in Dongcheng district of Beijing city. It is the last remaining temple for worshipping the God of the Earth. It was built 1530 during the reign of the Emperor Jiajing of the Ming Dynasty (1368-1644) and now it become a public park. This was the sacred place used by the emperors of Ming and Qing dynasties to worship the God of the Earth. Many Chinese scholars come to Ditan in memory of a famous Chinese writer, Shi Tiesheng, with his famous novel "Me and Ditan", telling his Hellen Keller like lifestory after he lost his leg. ♥ The Drum and Bell Tower 北京钟鼓楼

Lying on the north-south axis line in Dongcheng district of Beijing City. Bell and Drum Towers are visibly prominent constructions and represent the symbol of this old city. They were built in 1272 and rebuilt twice after two fires. The bell and the drum were originally used as musical instruments in China. Afterward, at one period in history they were the time-telling center of the capital city during the Yuan, Ming and Qing Dynasties (1271-1911).

Imperial college and Confucius Temple 孔庙和国子监

It is located on Guozijian Street inside Anding Gate. The Temple of Confucius in Beijing is the place where people paid homage to Confucius during the Yuan Dynasty (1271-1368), Ming Dynasty (1368-1644) and Qing Dynasty (1644-1911). The Confucius Temple is inside the imperial academy. Confucius is regarded as the first teacher in China, so when a new semester of imperial academy was started, the emperor together with the students went to Confucius Temple and showed their respect towards teachers.

Its neighbor in the west is Beijing Guozijian (Imperial Academy), which was the institute of the highest education well preserved in China. It is like universities in modern times, but with the former "imperial examination system" that whoever entered this imperial academy, then he would get a position in Chinese government.

Many famous Chinese politicians had their careers here, as well as lots of foreign students from Korea, Japan, Vietnam, etc. During the Ming Dynasty there was GPA system in Chinese imperial academy, for who got a higher GPA than others he might get a better position in Chinese government. Ming Dynasty Tombs 明十三陵

It is located in 50 kilometers on the northwest from Beijing City. At the foot of Tianshou Mountain there is the Ming Tombs Scenic Area, where lie the mausoleums of thirteen emperors of the Ming Dynasty (1368 - 1644). Since 1409 when Zhu Di, the first emperor of the Ming Dynasty in Beijing, built his Changling Tomb here, the succeeding twelve emperors had their resting places built around Changling during the next 230 years, covering a total area of over 120 square kilometers. This is the best preserved mausoleum area with the most emperors buried. Every year millions of tourists come to the site to appreciate its long history and palatial architecture. 🔮 Xiangshan Park (Fragrance Hill) 香山

Fragrance Hills Park is located in the east part of Western Hills, in 28 kilometers on the northwest of Beijing city. It is very large, made up of hills and forest covering 400 acres (162 hectares). Both its natural sceneries and cultural relics are abundant. Xianglu Peak, literally Incense Burner Peak, 1,830 feet (558 meters) high, is its highest peak. Fragrant Hills Park or Xiangshan Park was first built in 1186 in the Jin Dynasty (1115-1234) and later expanded in the Yuan and Ming dynasties. This place is considered to be one of the 10 best sceneries in Beijing, where, especially, in fall you can see very beautiful trees with red maple-leafs. The best season of visiting is October. It is worth going there.

PERSONAL STORY by Jiayin Li



Hutong is really the place that offers you a glimpse of ancient Chinese life. In the center of Beijing, amid the noises of speedy traffic and modern infrastructures, there are still hundreds of alleys that stand in tranquility. In Beijing, we call these alleys "hutong". Formed by

hundreds of traditional Chinese quadrangles (or Siheyuan) in lines on both sides of the road, these narrow alleys built in the old dynasties are today still home to thousands of Beijing citizens.

Each morning, I walk for ten minutes through the hutong where my family live in to the busy subway station downtown. Those ten minutes give me a chance to observe if today's sky is blue, or the sparrows are jumping joyfully. In spring, I relax myself and wait for the magnolia at the turning corner to stun me; or in fall, I look at the green bean that uncle Zhou grew on his roof and wonder when will he be a guest at my house with a bag of green bean in his hand, so that we can taste the freshness of this fall together?

Every evening, the smell of cooking dishes from different houses mingles in the alley. The little game I enjoy playing is to guess what dishes different families will have tonight when I pass each quadrangle. Each family's smell has got its own character, making me think about the people living inside the gray walls and wooden red gates. Sometimes I hear the voice of a child, an old man singing Peking opera, or somebody playing erhu. I can't stop myself from imagining the life inside those yards. A family celebrating a new life's arrival and holding feasts, parents struggling to provide their children a good education, a new bride vexing about how to get along with with her mother-in-law, or a grandfather pondering over the list of foods to buy tomorrow morning in the market. Generation after generation, the world changes, but the essence of the life in hutong never change. That is, the Chinese definition of happiness: enjoying the peaceful family life.

Therefore, my friend, if you are coming to Beijing, I wish you to spend some time in hutong. It could be an afternoon, or at sunset, or whenever you feel like to. Have a little walk there. If you find a tea house in the alley, ask for a hot jasmine green tea. If you find a yard behind those red gates and stone lions, sit in the yard under some trees for a while. And maybe you will meet new people. I hope you enjoy your peace and warmth in your heart in Beijing.

A City of Religion

As the cultural center of a country that embraces multiculturalism since Tang Dynasty, Beijing is also a city where believers from all religions gather, cultivate their own inner world, and exert their influence to all over China and worldwide. Over hundreds of years, people in Beijing have built glorious legacies for various religions. From the Yonghe Lama Temple(雍和宫) where the reincarnations of Dalai Lama were chosen, to Longquan Temple(龙泉寺) in the suburban mountain where monks determine to revive Zen and peace with innovative technology, Buddhists found Beijing both a frontier and a holy place. Beijing is also where the Chinese Taoist Association (白 云观) locates, making it a center of Taoism, a native religion of China for thousands of years that believes in "the proper way" years that believes in "the proper way" and the relations between humans and nature. Christianity has been influential in China since 17th century. Some even claims that Beijing is now home to more than 100,000 Christians. The St. Joseph's Church(王府井天主堂) in Wangfujing and Chongwenmen Christian Church(基督教会崇文门堂) are one of the most renowned churches in Beijing and even provides English services. Built in year 996 of Song Dynasty and designed with traditional Chinese art style, the Niujie Mosque(牛街清真寺) is one of the oldest mosques in China and also a famous mosque worldwide. Protected by the emperors, it was built into a magnificent architectural complex and is well reserved. Today, as the national center of Buddhism, Christianity, Taoism, Islamism, and etc., Beijing provides spiritual guide to all people who are interested.

A City of Museums

According to the Beijing Municipal Administration of Cultural Heritage, there are 164 museums in Beijing. Each of these museums has their own themes, and introduces Beijing and China from separate perspectives. Here are some museums that might interest you:

National Museum of China(中国国家博物馆): A museum that locates on the Tian'anmen Square, introduces Chinese history and culture. Many of the national treasures are preserved and exhibited here.

National Art Museum of China(中国美术馆): a journey to start understanding Chinese art.

Capital Museum(首都博物馆): a museum that specifically introduces the history and culture of Beijing.

Beijing Ancient Architecture Museum(北京古代建筑博物馆) : a very quiet museum inside the Altar of Agriculture(先农坛, the altar where the emperor worships the god of agriculture). **Zhihua Temple**(智化寺): more than just a Buddhist temple. Besides the exquisite murals and sculptures, the exhibition of

traditional Chinese music of Ming Dynasty(1368-1644) is another highlight for the museums in Beijing. Highly recommend the music performance that played twice everyday(except Monday) at 10am in the morning and 3pm in the afternoon. The music is played completely in Ming style, which is rare to hear today, even in China.

Chinese Ethnic Culture Park(中华民族园): There are 56 ethnic groups in China, each speaks a different language and has different cultures. The park presents customs from different ethnicity through architectures, foods, performances and activities that all people can participate.

Mutton Hotpot 涮羊肉 Shuàn Yáng Ròu

When cold wind blows down from Mongolia each winter, people in Beijing enjoy eating mutton hotpot with family and friends. On the table of New Year's Eve, mutton hotpot will be the cuisine that no one wants to miss.

Peking Duck 北京烤鸭 Běi Jīng Kǎo Yā

Peking Duck might be the most famous Beijing food in the nation. The duck is roasted so well, that the skin becomes crisp and the meat remains delicate. In combine with sauce of different flavors, Chinese pancake, scallion and cucumber, this one dish makes up a feast. If you order a bowl of duck soup(鸭 架汤) along with it, every Chinese will be happy and content with such delicacy.

Fried Sauce Noodles 炸酱面 Zhá Jiàng Miàn

Try this classical noddles in Beijing! The Fried sauce made from soybean paste and pork put on the noodles and cucumber, carrot, and bean sprout create a refreshing and salty taste.

Kebab 撸串 Lū Chuàn

Want to try a local Chinese life? Grab a seat in the Hutong, order some kebabs and a beer. You become a Beijinger in a

minute. In summer nights, you will find hundreds of Beijinger doing the exact same thing.

Bao Du er 爆肚儿

Boil the the sliced pieces of a sheep's stomach in boiling water for a few minutes, then this easily cooked dish will be served with special sauce that is exquisitely made. A halal cuisine that Beijingers adopted from the Muslim community.

"Fried Bracelet" 焦圈 Jiāo Quān er

Now a common snack on Beijing's street, fried bracelet was once the food only served to the royal family. Made from flour and fried in oil into crisp, it is the perfect match of a cup of soy milk.

Donkey Burger 驴肉火烧 Lǘ Ròu Huǒ Shāo

According to folklore, Chinese donkey burger was first invented in the army in 15th century. Try this dish with typical North China flavor and discover how a Chinese burger differentiate from a western one.

Sweet Sesame Bun 糖火烧 Táng Huǒ Shāo

A local Beijinger's first choice for breakfast, sweet sesame bun was a Manchuria desert brought by the Manchus in 17th century.

City Transportation

Subway/ Bus

Beijing is the first city in China to have a subway. Although often crowded, the subway is the fastest way to get around the center city area. Right now there are 16 subway lines and Airport Express. For international tourists visiting Beijing, some basic knowledge of the main subway lines, like Line 1, Line 2, Line 4 and Line 5, is quite helpful. These four subway lines take you to almost all the major attractions in Beijing. The subway stations are clean and have English signs directing tourists to the exits near places that you are likely trying to find **Public Transport Card**

1. The transport card can be used in buses, subway and trains.

2. You can buy and charge the card in all subway stations and the most biggest bus stations.

3. You have to pay RMB 20 for deposit and get the money back when you return the card.

4. You should swipe the card when you getting on and off the bus.

5. Using the transportation card will save visitors' 60% cost. Fare for subway: from RMB 3 and up, it depends of the distance.

Fare for bus: from RMB 1 and up, it depends on the distance (card): RMB 2 for one ride.

Fare for bus: from RMB 1 and up, it depends on the distance (card); RMB 2 for one ride.



How to search for places?


